| Academic Requirements | | Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA or equivalent | | | | | |
| Language Requirements for Non-Native English Speakers | | Non-native English speakers are required to have attained an English proficiency level of TOEFL 79 (internet-based) or IELTS 6.5 or above. | | | | | |
| English as a Second Language (ESL) | | All international students for whom English is not a first language will be registered for ENG 111 ESL class. While TOEFL or IELTS scores remain a valuable indicator of English language proficiency, students will take the MTELP English Language Exam during the International Student Orientation. Students who receive a high score on the MTELP will have the option to remove the ENG 111 ESL course from their schedules. If the MTELP score is not considered proficient by Baldwin Wallace, students will be required to complete ENG 111 ESL, regardless of any credit a student may/may not receive at your home institution for the course. | | | | | |
| | | Minimum 12 credit hours – in order to remain in status with immigration (approx. 4 courses) Maximum 18 credit hours – based on tuition and exchange agreement (approx. 6 courses) | | | | | |

| Transcripts | | Due to privacy laws in the United States, ISS Staff cannot request transcripts. Students are responsible for requesting their own transcript from BW through TranscriptsPlus (http://www.transcriptsplus.net/order). | | | | | |
| Course Schedule Preference (see application) | | Students are expected to select BW classes that fulfill requirements as established by their home institution degree or program plan. A copy of the home institution degree or program plan must be submitted along with syllabi or course descriptions to prove a student has met the pre-requisite knowledge needed for selected classes. When necessary, an academic advisor will be in contact with students via email prior to course registration. Once on campus all students meet with an academic advisor before classes begin to review their schedules. | | | | | |

| Supporting Documents | Complete international student exchange undergraduate application Complete course schedule preference form Submit an original copy of the official transcript in English Submit copy of signed passport Provide evidence of the student's financial standing in English, e.g. bank statements, savings account, scholarship letters, etc. *If someone other than the student is paying (i.e. a parent), a letter of support must be included. Provide English language proficiency proof (TOEFL or IELTS), for non-native English speakers | | | | | | |
| Student Visa Application | Upon receiving a BW acceptance letter and I-20 form. Students must follow steps on https://www.fmjfee.com/ Apply for and obtain their F-1 visa permit Note: All exchange students must apply and obtain an F-1 visa permit in order to study in the United States. | | | | | | |

Accommodation and Facilities

University Housing

- All exchange students are required to live on campus.
- Standard rooms are doubles, meaning students will live with a roommate
 - o Single rooms with no roommate are available, but very limited and cost an additional fee
- Students must complete housing application after acceptance to BW on bw.erezlife.com.
- Included in all individual rooms: Bed, Desk, Dresser and Rented Linen*
 - o *During ISS orientation, students will have opportunity to purchase their own linens and must return rented linens
- Included in common area: Kitchenettes, public study spaces

Meal Plan

- Exchange Students on a **tuition only** exchange will be enrolled in the Prime Plan:
 - o A set number of meals per week (21) and a set amount of flex dollars to be used on campus.
 - o This can be adjusted during the 1st two weeks on campus depending on the student's needs
- Full Exchange students (Tuition, Room and Meal exchange) will receive a Prime Meal plan (21 meals per week, no flex).
